Council News - Report from the Clerk



Dear All,

This edition should reach you in the week before the Remembrance Commemorations, and I hope that as many of you as possible will gather at the Church and then the Memorial for this event. It was gratifying that so many were able to come to the rededication ceremony in the Summer, and what a moving occasion it was.

A few weeks later we received final confirmation that the Beach Footpath was a reality. Hopefully we can now move on and see the divisions that this caused come to an end.

Over the next few months there are many important decisions to be made, not least on the planning application we expect to receive for the proposed solar farm. If you have missed out on this, I would urge you to try and find out more; such large developments require as much input as possible. We are also holding meetings to discuss the drainage in the Village, which we know is a major concern of the public. If you have any comments on either issue, please contact the Parish Office in the first instance.

You may have noticed work going on at the Common. We are developing the area near the car parking, which we hope to make a pleasant place to sit, maybe have a picnic, and enjoy the special atmosphere of the Woods. In coming months work will be taking place to improve the heather bed, and clear the pit. All of these improvements are geared towards making the Common a place welcoming to both flora and fauna and for local people.

Also over the next few months you will notice the street-lighting in the Village being changed. Details of this are on the insert to this edition of the TORC.

On a less positive note, I inevitably mention dog-mess – I gather from colleagues that it is the single largest subject for contact by Parishioners county-wide. Please use the bins provided. I have also been asked to remind everyone that disposing of garden waste by the roadside still counts as fly-tipping – please also avoid this.

To help with the sometimes confusing delivery of service by different local councils, we have put a copy of the streetscene list on the Office Notice Board and the website.

As you know Council is always looking for new members, and there are still places available. It is also worth bearing in mind that in May, as well as the General Election, we have elections to the Parish Council. If you would be interested in becoming a member of the Council, either now by co-option, or at the election next year, please get in touch with me for information.

Finally, as it is the last chance to do so in print, may I wish you all a very enjoyable and Happy Christmas and New Year on behalf of the Council.

Hall's Exhibition Foundation

The last two months has seen the awarding of the annual educational grants to pupils and students of Snettisham. Most grant applications have now been processed and the grants forwarded.

The grants available are in the following categories:

Grants at 11+ £200 for pupils moving on from Primary to Secondary education

Grants at 16+ £200 annually for students staying on in further education or apprenticeships for each of their years of study.

Grants at 18+ £2,000 annually for students moving on to higher education for each of their years of study.

Last year these grants totalled £68,000.

The hospice has been based in Snettisham since it came into being, firstly in 22a Common Road, and when we outgrew this site, at a second at other side of the bypass; this site was large enough to accommodate the fundraising office as well, which had previously been in the middle of the village.

Over the years, we have received tremendous support from the village, but our success as a hospice meant that we needed to move once again. We were lucky enough to be able to build a much larger bespoke facility in Hillington from where we will enter our third stage of expansion, offering even more services and in 2015, a much needed inpatient facility.

So it is with a mixture of sadness and excitement that we bid farewell to our fellow villagers in Snettisham and said hello to those of Hillington. However, we are not leaving Snettisham altogether; our shop will remain in there, and we all want to continue to be part of the village.

So really ... we are saying **'thank you'** and **'au revoir'** to the people of Snettisham, not 'goodbye'.
