The meeting began at 7pm

- 2014.06.02.01 There was an apology for absence from Cllr Bailey. The Chair welcomed Lilian Richardson as a non-Councillor member of the Beach Footpath Working Group [BFWG]; there were no objections to her being present to report and advise. For convenience the Chair requested that items 5 and 4 be interchanged.
- 2014.06.02.02 There were no objections to the public being excluded under the relevant legislation as on the agenda.
- 2014.06.02.03 There were no declarations of interest.

2014.06.02.05 – EL and LR: Council were informed a large document had arrived within the last week, from the objectors to the footpath, consisting of supporting evidence and new argument. This breach of planning inquiry rules had prejudiced the Council case by not allowing satisfactory time or opportunity to respond or rebut points made. Following a lengthy discussion of options, Council resolved that "Due to the Planning Inquiry rules regarding submission of documents not being adhered to, if the late submitted paperwork is not withdrawn, Council authorises its agent, John Trevelyan, to seek an adjournment of the Inquiry, should he so decide."

2014.06.02.04 – [LR left the meeting at 8pm.] EL and SB reported that communications had started to be received from HMRC following EL's continued letter-writing. HMRC had conceded that they would not seek VAT prior to 2009. This left 09/10, 10/11, 11/12 and 12/13. (13/14 had been paid as we went along). Advice was sought from Council as to how negotiations might proceed. A variety of views were expressed. EL and SB to continue the process bearing these and other points in mind.
